Syllabus/Plan d'étude¹

1) Kurzfassung (max.5 Zeilen)/short version (maximum 5 lines)/résumé (de 5 lignes maximum):

An examination of the role of alcohol in a diplomatic and cross-cultural context. The course attempts to avoid the usual theoretical work (Cassis de Dijon etc) and hence places special emphasis on the practical aspects of alcoholism. Students will be expected to demonstrate a thorough knowledge of the applied subject. A flawless accent is not required for the presentations, though extra credit may be given to students able to demonstrate such ability.

Lecture 1 – Introduction

Basic topics (including the necessity for glass/mouth coincidence) will be introduced, before a discussion of the postulated existence of a mutual exclusivity between quality and quantity of drinking. A brief overview of the effects of alcohol, including some extreme examples, will be presented in order to give a flavour of the rest of the course.

Lecture 2 - Food

Lecture 4 – Alcoholism abroad
